Application Process for Students w/ Disabilities

Where to find the application: On the application itself

When to apply: By the November 15th Early Action Deadline

How to disclose: On the application, you would select that you are interested in the support program. Applicants to the [Institute for Achievement and Learning](#) should submit a current (within three years) psycho-educational evaluation.

Programs/Services Offered by the Disability Services Office

Receive coaching, tutoring, testing and more

Academic coaching

Certified academic coaches provide learning strategies that reduce symptoms related to students' deficits in executive functioning.

Assistive technology

Computer software programs (Dragon, Inspiration, Kurzweil, NaturallySpeaking, Kurzweil, Read&Write Gold, etc.) help students increase reading and writing competency.

Programs/Services Offered by the Disability Services Office (Continued)

Institute fellows

Teach select Dialogues, which ensure the incorporation of a variety of different teaching and learning strategies.

Testing Center

Provides students with the option to take extended-time exams in an alternative testing environment. Reader, scribe and computer access is available for assistance recording answers to test responses. Students must make prior arrangements with their professors to use the facility and while taking their exams, they must follow the center's established rules and procedures.

Programs/Services Offered by the Disability Services Office (Continued)

The Harold, Nathan and Dorothy Wayser Tutoring Center

Master's and doctoral-level professionals offer a variety of tutoring options in a one-on-one setting.

- **Content tutoring:** subject-specific to aid in the student's comprehension of material presented in class
- **Group tutoring:** two or more students working on the same project
- **Process tutoring:** focuses on the elements or concepts required for successful writing, speaking and organizing

The Donna and Jeffrey Eskind Family Writing Center

A staff of writing experts offer guidance while students work on essays.

Mental Health Resources

Our on-campus counseling center is comprised of licensed psychotherapists and offers free counseling services for enrolled students combating personal, social, academic and emotional distress. Services include individual, couples, family and group counseling sessions, and alcohol and drug abuse prevention and treatment.

Lynn's Counseling Center has been fully accredited by the International Association of Counseling Services, Inc. until 2024.

Mental Health Resources

The Counseling Center helps with issues you may be facing, including

- Depression and anxiety
- Adjustment to college life, homesickness, social and academic transition
- Interpersonal/relationship difficulties, loneliness
- Family conflict
- Issues about sexuality
- Identity development and issues related to diversity
- Eating behaviors and body image
- Management of emotions
- Alcohol and substance use, relapse prevention
- Trauma/assault
- Personal growth and development, identification of coping style
- Psychiatric evaluation and medication management

Mental Health Resources

Some of the issues commonly addressed through the referral to community resources include:

- Chronic suicidality and/or self-injury behaviors
- History of repeated suicide attempts
- Indication that short-term therapy may be detrimental or non-beneficial
- Evidence or risk of progressive deterioration in mental or emotional functioning requiring intensive intervention
- Presence of psychotic symptoms without willingness to remain on medication for stabilization
- Presence of significant drug and/or alcohol problems such as current substance dependence, primary substance abuse and/or past failed treatments
- Presence of significant or long-standing eating disorder with no period of remission, no previous treatment, or that may pose a medical danger
- Treatment for physically or sexually aggressive or inappropriate behavior

Disability Specific Resources
