How to Apply to the University of Dayton

The University of Dayton has two deadlines for submitting your admission materials:

Early action (non-binding): November 1

Regular decision: February 1

Necessary Materials: To be considered for admission, submit the following items:

- Application (including essay). Submit your free application using the Common Application, the Coalition Application or the University of Dayton Application.
- Official high school transcript
- ACT and/or SAT scores, if desired. The University of Dayton is test-optional in admission for the fall 2021 entering class and beyond. If you have questions about submitting test scores, please review our Test Score Policy page.

- **Who we serve:** Undergraduate, Graduate and Law School Students at the University of Dayton, as well as prospective students
- **Accommodations may be:** Academic, for classroom and testing environments, or Non-Academic, such as housing, parking and dining
- **Defining disability:** OLR looks at a broad definition of disability, so if you have any physical or mental health condition that impacts your academic performance, we encourage you to reach out to OLR



Case Management

- Case management is about helping students overcome obstacles. This may be driven by the need to learn about accommodations or help using your accommodations
- While this is more an ongoing support than an “accommodation,” it is a valuable part of services available to students



Sample Academic Accommodations

Classroom

- Audio recording lectures
- Copies of instructional material
- Breaks during class
- Assistive technology and alternative formats
- Interpreters for the deaf
- Attendance flexibility

Testing

- Extended time to complete tests
- Distraction-reduced environment
- Technology use during an exam



Sample Non-Academic Accommodations

Housing

- No more than one roommate in a shared bedroom
- Access to A+ Dining room for help in managing food allergies
- Living in close proximity to campus

Parking

- Access to disability parking spaces
- Medical transport from your residence to campus building



How can I get started with the Accommodation Request Process?

- ☞ Complete the online [Initial Accommodation Request form](#)
- ☞ Schedule an appointment with OLR by calling 937-229-2066
- ☞ Provide most recent documentation to support your accommodation request(s)
 - Do this before, during or after your appointment
- ☞ Meet with Disability Staff

UD Counseling Center

The Counseling Center is a component of Student Development that provides the University of Dayton students with psychological, vocational, and educational support systems.

The major responsibility of the Counseling Center is to assist each student in personal growth and development. The highest degree of confidentiality is maintained so as to encourage the student to gain the necessary confidence and trust in the staff.

Emergency Help

Emergency assistance is provided 24 hours a day during the academic year when the residence halls are open. Immediate psychological help is available either by calling the Counseling Center during business hours or after hours, by calling Public Safety.

- **Academic Coaching** to help students develop skills in time management, studying, note-taking, testing and more.
- **Global Learning Support** to take advantage of learning from and with people of different cultures.
- **Supplemental Instruction** which is weekly group review sessions led by peer facilitators.
- **Technology Support** to provide text-to-speech and speech-to-text type software on student computers as part of the disability accommodation process.
- **Tutoring** for UD students at no additional cost during fall and spring semester for designated classes.
