# APPLICATION PROCESS FOR STUDENTS W/ DISABILITIES

**Where to find the application:** To request accommodations, students should complete the **New Student Application** found on our [homepage](#).

**When to apply:** Students can apply **any time after they have been admitted to Mizzou**. For students beginning coursework in the fall, housing accommodation requests are typically processed beginning in January/February and academic accommodation meetings are often scheduled during the summer months leading up to the start of the Fall semester.

**How to disclose:** Our primary source of documentation is **student self-report**. However, you may be asked to submit third-party documentation before your eligibility can be finalized. **If you already have documentation (e.g. psychoeducational evaluation, letter from physician), we encourage you to upload it with your application or bring it with you to your access planning meeting.** Otherwise, your access advisor will clarify what documentation is needed during your initial appointment.

# PROGRAMS/SERVICES OFFERED BY THE DISABILITY CENTER

**Accommodations:** The Disability Center is primarily known for its role in establishing student eligibility for accommodations. Accommodations are determined by a case-by-case basis and may include **exam accommodations** (e.g. extended time, distraction reduced environment), **classroom accommodations** (e.g. peer notes, CART services), **alternative textbook formats**, and accommodations pertaining to **Residential Life**, **Campus Dining**, or **Parking & Transportation**.

**Scholarships:** MU students with disabilities are eligible for several scholarships through the office. # PROGRAMS/SERVICES OFFERED BY THE DISABILITY CENTER

**Faculty Mentor Program:** As a student with a disability, you may experience new challenges as you progress through your academic career. Our mentoring program is designed to connect you with someone who can offer support, encouragement and guidance on handling academic relationships and the demands of college. Faculty mentors understand disability and the accommodations process. They represent many different majors and interests. All of our mentors want you to succeed!

Students can talk to their faculty mentor about: Mizzou resources and the way things work on campus; Talking with instructors about accommodations; How to balance the demands of school; Deciding on a career path; Finding opportunities to connect; And many other topics.



# MENTAL HEALTH RESOURCES

The **Counseling Center** ([counseling.missouri.edu/](https://counseling.missouri.edu/)) provides a range of services designed to help students navigate life challenges while in college. We offer skill building workshops, group therapy, brief individual therapy, referral services, and 24/7 crisis support.

Our professional staff includes licensed psychologists and counselors, licensed social workers, psychological residents, psychological interns, and doctoral level graduate students in psychology.

**Eligibility for Treatment:** Any undergraduate or graduate student currently enrolled at the MU campus is eligible for initial evaluation, crisis support, and referral services. Please see our Scope of Care statement ([counseling.missouri.edu/scope-of-care/](https://counseling.missouri.edu/scope-of-care/)) for more information about our range of services.

**Scheduling:** Students can schedule an initial evaluation by calling 573-882-6601. Crisis support is available by phone 24/7.

**Initial Evaluation Session:** The purpose of the initial evaluation is to assess the student's current needs and what services are most appropriate (e.g., workshop, group, individual, counseling, referral, etc). At the evaluation, students will complete a questionnaire and meet with a therapist to explore their concerns, background information, and what they hope to gain from counseling. If the Center is not a good fit for the student's needs, we will offer referrals to other campus resources or community providers.



# MENTAL HEALTH RESOURCES

The **Student Health Center** offers psychiatry services to enrolled MU students ([studenthealth.missouri.edu/psychiatry/](https://studenthealth.missouri.edu/psychiatry/)). Our psychiatrists are affiliated with the University of Missouri Department of Psychiatry. Faculty attending psychiatrists are board certified by the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology, and have experience working with the college population. Our psychiatrists collaborate with the physicians, advanced practice nurses and nurses at the Student Health Center and counselors at the Counseling Center and elsewhere.

**Our psychiatrists have expertise in:** Moderate to severe depression, Anxiety, Bipolar disorders, Psychotic disorders, Personality disorders, ADHD, Substance abuse, Eating disorders, Neurodevelopmental disorders including autism spectrum

**Services offered include:** Diagnostic psychiatric assessments, Medication evaluation; prescription and management; Referrals and assistance with establishing care with another local provider

If you have been previously diagnosed or prescribed psychotropic medication, it is very helpful for your new SHC psychiatrist to review your previous records before your first visit. You may sign a record release form and send it to your previous provider. If that is not feasible, you may complete it at your initial appointment. As appropriate, the psychiatrist may refer you to MU Counseling Center or to community resources.
