

The Career Skills Institute

The Harper College Career Skills Institute (CSI) is an educational program for students with mild cognitive disabilities, ages 18 and above. CSI assesses and strengthens basic employability skills and helps student develop realistic career plans.

Two Year Sequence

Year one includes six modules focusing on basic academics and communication. Year two includes six modules focusing on career exploration with a guided vocational experience.

How CSI students benefit

- Build academic, vocational, and social skills.
- Learn appropriate work behavior and problem solving skills for the workplace.
- Develop career-related interests.
- Receive an honest assessment of their career potentials
- Better understand the continuing supports they will require in the workplace.

Admission Procedure

- STEP 1: Submit Application & Recommendation
- STEP 2: Participate in Student Interview
- STEP 3: Get the Admission Decision

A Learning Community

Cohorts of not more than fifteen students stay together for two years. They are trained by professional support staff and instructors.

Who Should Apply?

Students who:

- have been diagnosed with a mild intellectual disability
- are able to independently find their way to classes with minimal orientation.
- have transportation arrangements (Harper does not provide transportation)
- possess appropriate public behavior
