ClemsonLIFE is a two to four year certificate program for young adults with intellectual disabilities between the ages of 18 and 26.

ClemsonLIFE offers a collegiate experience that prepares young men and women with intellectual disabilities for competitive employment and independent living through a combination of academic coursework and career exploration.

ClemsonLIFE students take classes in

- Functional Mathematics
 - Banking, budgeting
- Functional Literacy/Technology
 - Bus schedules, maps, email
- Independent Living
 - Shopping, cooking, cleaning
- Social Skills and Self Advocacy
 - Communication
- Employment Skills
 - Job search, interviewing, resumes
- Health and Wellness
 - Hygiene, boundaries, relationships
- Clemson University leisure skills classes



ClemsonLIFE students gain work experience through

- Employment on campus
- Employment in the community
- Athletic internships

ClemsonLIFE students are active in the Clemson community participating in Greek life, student clubs, swim team, workout classes, attending sporting events, and more.
