How to Apply to the University of Dayton

The University of Dayton has two deadlines for submitting your admission materials:

- Early action (non-binding): November 1
- Regular decision: February 1

You will automatically be considered for a merit Scholarship — worth up to \$121,000 — when you apply for admission. You can apply using: [UD's Application](#), [Common Application](#) or the [Coalition Application](#). Regardless of which application you choose, applying is free and test scores are not required.

Who we serve: undergraduate, graduate and law school students as well as prospective students.

Accommodations types: Academic (classroom and testing), or Non-Academic (housing, parking and dining)



Case Management

- Case management is about helping students overcome obstacles. This may be driven by the need to learn about accommodations or help using your accommodations
- While this is more an ongoing support than an “accommodation,” it is a valuable part of services available to students



Sample Academic Accommodations

Classroom

- Audio recording lectures
- Copies of instructional material
- Breaks during class
- Assistive technology and alternative formats
- Interpreters for the Deaf
- Attendance flexibility

Testing

- Extended time
- Distraction-reduced environment
- Technology use during an exam



Sample Non-Academic Accommodations

Housing

- No more than one roommate in a shared bedroom
- Access to A+ Dining room for help in managing food allergies
- Living in close proximity to campus

Parking

- Access to disability parking spaces
- Medical transport from your residence to campus building



How can I get started with the Accommodation Request Process?

- ☞ Complete the online [Initial Accommodation Request form](#)
- ☞ Schedule an appointment with OLR by calling 937-229-2066 Option 4
- ☞ Provide most recent documentation to support your accommodation request(s)
 - Do this before, during or after your appointment
- ☞ Meet with Disability Staff



Campus Mental Health Resources

UD Counseling Center

The Counseling Center is a component of Student Development that provides the University of Dayton students with psychological, vocational, and educational support systems.

The major responsibility of the Counseling Center is to assist each student in personal growth and development. The highest degree of confidentiality is maintained so as to encourage the student to gain the necessary confidence and trust in the staff.

Emergency Help

Emergency assistance is provided 24 hours a day during the academic year when the residence halls are open. Immediate psychological help is available either by calling the Counseling Center during business hours or after hours, by calling Public Safety.

Additional Resource: Academic Coaching

Working with an academic coach can help you study smarter by developing skills in time management, studying, note-taking, testing, and any other topics related to learning.

- All students have access to general academic coaching with is designed to be short-term.



Additional Resource: ACES - Academic Coaching Extended Services

Academic Coaching Extended Services (ACES) was developed to support students with Autism, but can also be helpful for students Attention Deficit Disorder, mental health conditions or other disabilities.

As part of this program, students meet weekly/bi-weekly throughout the semester to address specific focus areas related to academics.



Additional Resource: Technology Support

Technology Support is available to students who have a technology related academic accommodation.

Supports may include

- Specific software provided on student computers or via cloud based software.
- Online learning resources to help with questions about using the software.
- One-on-one introductory level training on various software.



Additional Resource: Supplemental Instruction

Supplemental Instruction (SI) review sessions are offered for many courses/sections. SI review sessions are free and available to any student in the supported course section. No pre-registration is required to attend SI review sessions—students may attend as many review sessions as they like.



Additional Resource: Tutoring

- The Office of Learning Resources' Tutoring service is certified by the College Reading & Learning Association (CRLA), which recognizes that our Tutors are trained to an internationally accepted superior standard.
- Peer Tutors help students develop a deeper understanding of class material, and gain successful skills.



Additional Resource: Write Place

The Mission of the Write Place is one of service: writing consultants appreciate the uniqueness of individual learners and work with all students in their efforts to become better writers. Write Place consultants encourage, guide, and support student writers on any writing assignment and at any stage of the writing process. Students can get support through drop-in, by appointment or with digital drop off.
