Application Process for Students w/ Disabilities

Where to find the application: Health care providers may use the disability documentation form found on our website: <https://www.marquette.edu/disability-services/forms.php>

When to apply: After you have been admitted & decided to attend Marquette, you may submit your documentation at any time. A reasonable amount of time is needed to review documentation and put accommodations into place, so we encourage students to do this as soon as possible.

How to disclose: Documentation may be emailed to ods@marquette.edu, faxed to us at 414-288-5799, dropped off or mailed to our office. It may be sent directly from the provider or the student.



Programs/Services Offered by the Disability Services Office

In addition to arranging formal accommodations, the Office of Disability Services at Marquette offers the following:

- **Supplemental Academic Support:** At these one-on-one meetings with an ODS staff member, students receive advising and guidance on multiple topics relating to academic success, including time management skills, study strategies, and effective textbook reading. Regular check-in meetings are available as well.
- **COMPASS Peer Mentor Program:** COMPASS (Community Of Marquette Peers Advising + Supporting Students) is a peer mentor program in ODS for students with disabilities, offering support, guidance, and leadership through developing a meaningful personal relationship, connected by shared experience. Mentees are paired with upperclassmen students who are also registered with ODS.
- **On Your Marq:** On Your Marq (OYM) is a college success program designed to assist students on the autism spectrum in navigating the college landscape at Marquette University.
