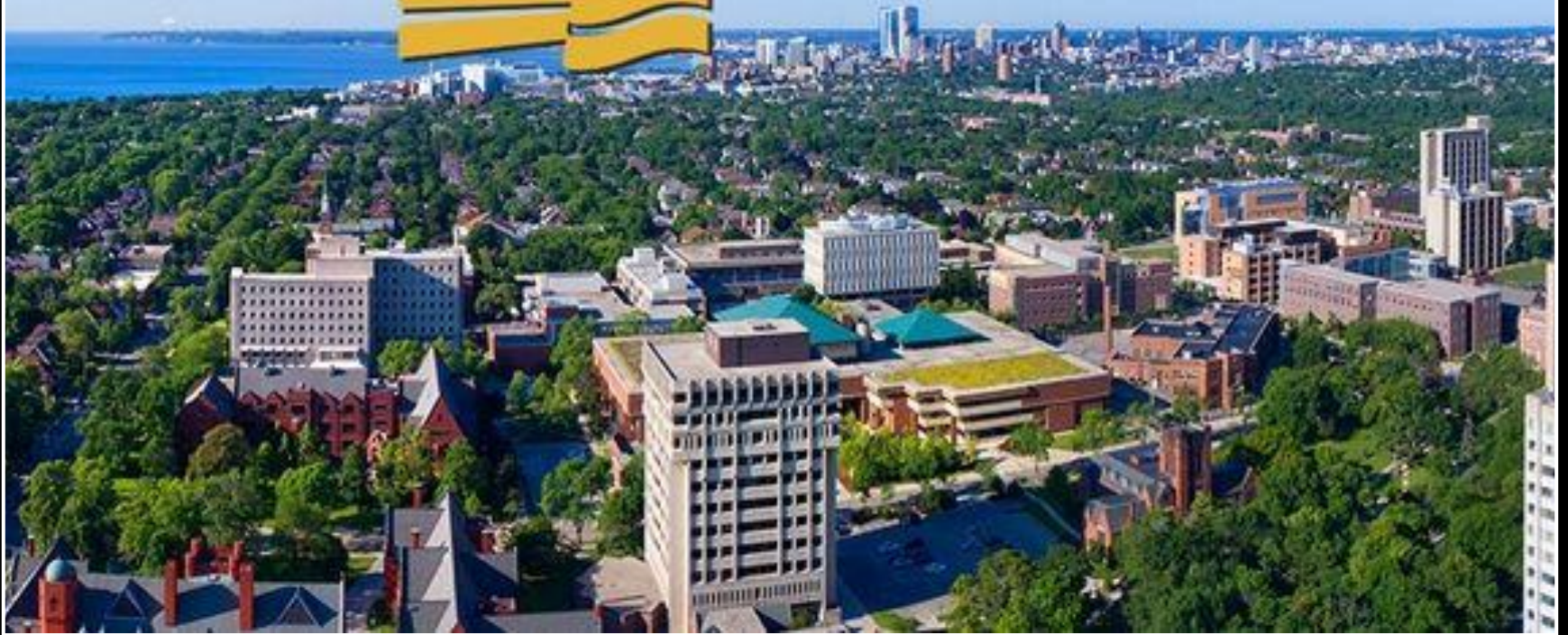

Type of School: UW-Milwaukee has 3 campuses; Main campus is a 4-year college; Waukesha and Washington County campuses are 2-year colleges

- Waukesha campus in Waukesha: 1,544
- Washington County campus in West Bend: 605

Application Process

Common App/Institutional App: Institutional App/UWM App for all students and Common App for New Freshmen only:

Deadlines: March 1, 2021 admission application priority deadline for Fall 2021.
May 1, 2021 confirmation deposit and housing contract due for Fall 2021

Necessary Materials:

- UW-system application
- Application fee or fee waiver
- High school or college transcript
- ACT/SAT scores (optional this year for Fall 2021 new freshmen)
- Letters of recommendation not required, but considered if you send them
- Minimum requirements: 4 units English, 3 units each of Math, Natural Science and Social Science, 4 units of Academic Electives

Application Process for Students with Disabilities

1. Apply and get admitted to UW-Milwaukee
2. Submit an ARC Academic Accommodation application:

3. Submit disability documentation. [Documentation Guidelines](#)
4. Meet with ARC Access Specialist for an initial appointment before your first semester begins
 - Review documentation, student history and accommodations
 - Ask questions
 - Discuss how to access accommodations at UWM

Examples of Academic Accommodations

- Alternative testing: extended time, minimally distracting environment, computer access, scribe, electronic reader
- Assistive technology: smart pen, software programs such as Read&Write, CCTV, screen readers, etc.
- Notetaking: smart pens, note-taking software (Glean)
- Alternative text: enlarged print, electronic (audio), braille
- Sign language interpreting
- Realtime Captioning
- Laboratory and Library Assistance
