







What does transition to college look like for a student with a disability?"

Things I would invite **ALL** students to do **BEFORE** graduating:

Can I answer these 3 questions:

- 1) What is my disability?
- 2) Do I know the accommodations I'm receiving?
- 3) "How does my disability impact me within the academic setting?"

By answering these questions, my team will be able to engage in a conversation to determine reasonable & appropriate accommodations. Those accommodations are based on the **impact** within the academic environment which may include:

- Extended Time on Assessments (exam, quizzes, etc.)
- Reduced Distracted Testing/Quiet Room
- Sign Language Interpreters
- Assistive Technology
- Notetakers
- Many others Accommodations are assigned on a case-by-case basis

Transition to College means a transition of ownership. Students drive the narrative. You are in control. However, you are not alone. We are here to help you.
